

Michael Yankovich is an Academy Professor in the Department of Mathematical Sciences where he teaches Linear Optimization (MA481) and Mathematics for the Social Sciences (MA367). Prior to assuming duties as the Vice Dean for Operations, he served as the Director of the Plebe (Freshman) Mathematics Program and as the Director of the Center for Faculty Development. His previous operational assignments include leading platoons of combat engineers in the 1st Cavalry Division, serving as the headquarters detachment commander and adjutant of the 1st Engineer Brigade, commanding a combat engineer company in the 5th Engineer Battalion, working as an Operations Research Analyst on the Army Staff (G8), and serving as an Operations Research Analyst on the Strategic Advisory Group for the Commander of the International Security Assistance Force in Kabul. He earned a Bachelor of Science while majoring in mathematical economics at West Point (1994), earned a Master of Public Policy degree from Duke's Sanford Institute of Public Policy (2003), and completed a PhD in Economics at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology. His dissertation examined exposure to the risk of death and its impact on human capital formation. In addition to his work as Vice Dean, he serves as the Head Officer Representative for Army West Point Men's Basketball team, as West Point's Liaison to the Highland Falls Fort Montgomery Central School District School Board, and as a youth soccer coach with the Junior Black Knight's Soccer Club.
