Island No. 10 fell to Pope on 7 April 1862.

Ft. Pillow evacuated by Confederate garrison 2-5 June 1862.

Halleck assumed overall command of ground forces in mid-July 1862. He left his second in command (Grant) with 67,000 troops which were sacrificed to protect a variety of points, some of which are identified.

Pope joined Halleck at Hamburg after Island No. 10 fell, with 30,000 troops. He began arriving between 22 April and 22 May.

Memphis surrendered to Federal forces after Confederate river flotilla was defeated 6 June 1862.
