



The strength of the main Federal enveloping force (V, XI & XII Corps) was 42,000. Couch's II Corps (-Gibbon) had a strength of 12,000.

The area designated as The Wilderness is characterized by low lying, softly rolling terrain and swampy areas. Vegetation is extremely thick and overgrown, consisting of oak, maple, ash, cedar and fir trees. Many of these trees are laced with vines and sycophant growth. There were a few primitive roads running through the area, and the movement of horses and wheeled traffic was restricted to these. The entire area was an obstacle to maneuver. The terrain on the map south and east of an imaginary line running through Todd's Tavern-Tabernacle Church-Bank's Ford is rolling farmland and wooded lots-quite different than the wilderness.
