



TERMS of TILSIT PEACE

FRANCE:
 Alliance with Russia in event of continuing war in Europe.
 Allowed Frederick William III to retain Prussian throne.
 Guaranteed Russian territories east of the Duchy of Warsaw.

RUSSIA:
 Agreed to adhere to the Continental System.
 Alliance with France in event of continuing war in Europe.
 Surrendered Ionian Islands and Cattaro to France.
 Recognized Napoleon's imperial jurisdiction in Western Europe.

PRUSSIA:
 Ceded to Napoleon all territory west of Elbe River.
 (Became Kingdom of Westphalia).
 Ceded all lands taken from Poland since 1772. (Became Duchy of Warsaw).
 Danzig became a free city, garrisoned by French troops.
 Prussian ports closed to British commerce.
 Recognized sovereignty of Joseph, Louis, and Jerome in Naples, Holland, and Westphalia.
 Population reduced from 10,000,000 to 5,000,000.
 Standing army limited to 42,000.
 Agreed to pay large war indemnity and support 150,000 man French occupation force.

No attempt has been made to depict the boundaries of minor states, principalities, and duchies in Germany and Italy. For simplicity, the identifications of many of these territories have been purposely omitted.
